President and Vice Chancellor

St. Jerome's University, situated in the heart of the University of Waterloo campus, is a public Catholic university federated with the University of Waterloo since 1960. In addition to the 900+ undergraduate students registered at St. Jerome's in its Faculties of Arts and Mathematics, more than 11,000 University of Waterloo students enroll in courses offered by St. Jerome's each year. Founded in 1865, St. Jerome's University remains committed to a liberal arts undergraduate education that addresses the student as a whole person, including the intellectual, social, and spiritual dimensions.

With a complement of 30 full-time faculty members, St. Jerome's University is home to several departments and/or programs of study, some of which are unique within the University of Waterloo: English, History, Italian & French Studies, Medieval Studies, Philosophy, Psychology, Religious Studies, Sexuality, Marriage & Family Studies, Sociology & Legal Studies, and Mathematics. St. Jerome's also offers the Master of Catholic Thought, a graduate theology program. Faculty members are active in graduate and undergraduate teaching, committee membership, and a wide range of scholarly research. Students are provided with service and community-based learning and research opportunities.

Reporting to the Board of Governors, the President and Vice Chancellor will champion St. Jerome's mission and strategic vision. An accomplished scholar, teacher and academic administrator, the President and Vice Chancellor will provide leadership and stewardship to the University. The President and Vice Chancellor must be a Catholic and embody the values of St. Jerome's as a student-centred, Catholic institution committed to learning, academic excellence in the liberal arts, and the development of Catholic lay leaders and socially committed citizens. A natural collaborator, the President and Vice Chancellor will work to create an environment characterized by strong relationships among students, faculty, staff and alumni.

The St. Jerome's University search committee will begin its review of candidates in October 2011 and will continue until the position is successfully filled. Candidates are asked to submit a curriculum vitae, a letter of introduction that addresses their strengths and qualifications related to this position, and the names of at least three referees.
